<u>Principal's Report</u> – Presented by: Michelle Makrigiorgos & Jennifer Condra

- As a reminder, next week is the end of the 2nd quarter. There's a two-hour early release on Wednesday, and Thursday & Friday are teach workdays
- As the end of the quarter arrives, the staff will be doing midyear assessments. When complete the staff/teams will do a "date dig" (how are the students doing, where are they doing really well, what are their needs) which will help guide the staff going into the second half of the year.
- Portrait of a Graduate (FCPS skill sets that focus on and support student success not only in school; but in life)
 - o January skill set is 'Communicator'
 - o Goal is every month to highlight one skill and provide information
- Renovation Update: Construction has been going really well. They're ahead of schedule thanks to some dry weather and a team that works weekends. Next step is looking at classroom spaces to order furniture, materials, etc.
- Students grades 3-6 are currently completing or have just completed their midyear VGA (Virginia Growth Assessments) requirements. Should receive scores in the mail in late February/early March
- Students grades 1-6 that were below the 40th percentile in the Fall assessment of iReady (screening with the iReady screener gives teachers information about strengths and needs in students' basic reading and mathematics skills) will be required to be reevaluated during this midyear analysis. Some teachers also choose to reassess students not required to retest to get another baseline of where they are.
- Advanced Math students in 6th grade just took the Iowa Algebra Aptitude Test (IAAT). Results from this assessment are used as one component of the course placement process for Algebra 1 Honors in Grade 7.
- Gearing up for the ESL students to take the WIDA (English Language Proficiency Assessment Information WIDA and WIDA Screener) which is required by Federal law for English learners in grades K-12
- Families of students in grades 3-6 who completed the Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) Screener (a screening assessment to measure social-emotional learning skills) during the fall window will be receiving a mailed report of the survey results this month. The survey offers valuable

information about a student's SEL skills, relationships, school environment, and well-being. Parent and guardians can use the Family Guide to understand your student's SEL Screener outcomes and facilitate discussions at home about the results. Ouestions:

- **1.** Field trips Noticed there were no field trips in the Fall. Would like to know if it depends on grade or are there standard guidelines?
 - It varies depends on grade level and curriculum. There was that hiatus during COVID so now teachers are reviewing things again (ie. If they are going to go somewhere they've been in the past or somewhere new, with COVID restrictions). Generally, tend to have more field trips in the Spring and typically, one field trip per grade level.
- 2. Will parents be notified of iReady Winter scores?

- Winter is a little different. Only certain students that are required however some teachers will choose to give to all students again to get another data point. Also, results should be in your SIS Parent Acct as well as mailed to you. Can reach out to your students teacher if your child took it. (Not a requirement except for the students who scored below the 40th percentile in the fall)
- 3. Construction Any chance the entire school will fit in the new addition next year, and is the cafeteria supposed to be ready by next year?
 - Yes to both however, the building is being built to occupy 700 students and currently there are just over 500. What we're going to have to look at is, how many classrooms will be needed at each grade level vs how many classes will be able to fit inside the new building? The goal to fit everyone but still may be some overflow. Also, they will be removing the modular next Fall which allows a little more time for construction that's needed to pour the new pavement and blacktop area that's going to be used for kiss & ride and parking.
- 4. Is there a chance we could get a construction lead to present at one of our next PTA meetings?
 - Yes. Leadership receives updates constantly and consistently. Also planning on giving kids an opportunity to hear and see some things too to get them engaged and excited about it. Michelle to inquire with constructions leadership when in the process might be most beneficial.
