Principal's Report – Michelle Makrigiorgos & Jennifer Condra

- Renovation Update: Some parents may have heard from their children that, due to construction, LAES has temporarily lost a portion of their playground. Essentially there is a storm drain that needs to be put in and the location of that is where the basketball courts and a portion of the playground area are. They have to excavate, put drain in, clean it up and in 3-4 weeks it would be wrapped up and we would have access to the playground again. They gave us about a weeks notice for that and the teachers/staff/PTA brainstormed about what to do and came up with corn hole boards and other indoor equipment the classes would rotate through. However, the construction team came back and said, 'the piping is actually not located where we thought, in fact, it's on a portion of a neighboring property' and access to playground was given back. It was a good dry run at least since we will not have access to the playground again in about a months time.
- In the summertime they are going to install blacktop, put up all new basketball court and playground equipment so when students return next school year, all of that will be ready.
- Though taken down due to COVID in past years, the salad bar is coming back starting March 13th.
- A SR&R (Students Right & Responsibilities) requirement is that we review/discuss expectations midyear. Teachers and/or Jennifer Condra will be going into classrooms and giving those reminders (ie. Keep hands to self, what is bullying & who to talk to, bus behavior, kindness, respect, technology use, etc)

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Steve Holiday

- We raised \$640 in January's Dining for Dollars at Chipotle who crushed it donating 33% of sales (that's huge).
- Expenses are essentially fine. We aren't going over budget except in the educational licenses and performing arts (Lion King).
- We do pay out a lot of money utilizing PayPal. Every transaction incurs a fee.
- Brought in \$38k in January (mostly after school activities).
