Treasurers Report......Steve Soliday

- Income: Total Income ~\$50k (Total Income less Programs = ~\$7,500)
  - □ Memberships & Donations
    - ▶ Membership up to ~\$4k however we still owe money back to the state PTA so goal of ~\$2k
    - Currently up to 269 members vs last years total of 157
  - Fundraisers:
    - Givebacks is starting to trickle in slowly. (If you haven't already, please consider downloading the browser extension or link your credit card. Doing so will 'giveback' to Louise Archer PTA).
  - □ Community Events :
    - Sock Hop pre-purchased tickets = ~\$250
    - Sock Hop expenses = \$400

- □ Student Support:
  - ▶ Reflections ceremony approaching funds being spent in preparation
- □ Parent, Teacher, & School Support:
  - Educational Licenses and Supply Closet have spent some funds
  - Classroom Funds is being used more than last year which is great. (\$100 per class + \$35 (split of the sixth grade class gift from last year))
  - Mini Grants items have been purchased and are starting to arrive. (Of note: we made our existing Amazon account into a Prime account (free shipping) by reducing the number of users down to one).

- Open Positions:
  - □ Read-a-thon Chair
    - ▶ A Read-a-thon is an event during which people read books for a certain period of time, often as a fundraising event. Participants set a reading goal and try to read more than they usually do. The volunteer tasks involved in a Read-a-thon include promoting the event, reading to children (or being read to by them) to encourage their progress, organizing and distributing prize incentives, and collecting tracking data.
  - □ STEAM Fair Chair
    - The purpose of the STEAM Fair is to provide an opportunity for student's to think critically and combine science, technology, engineering, art, and math skills. The STEAM chair will be needed to promote and implement the fair.
  - □ Walk to School / Safe Routes Chair
    - ▶ Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is an initiative that works to make it safe, convenient, and fun for children to walk and bicycle to and from schools. The goal is to get more children walking and bicycling to school, improve kids' safety, and increase health and physical activity. A PTA SRTS chair will assist in creating a travel safety plan that includes drop-off instructions for private vehicles as well as safe access for students walking or bicycling to school.

# □ Directory Co-chair

▶ The Directory Committee is in charge of creating the Louise Archer Elementary Directory, which contains the contact information of LAES families who opt in. The goal is to facilitate communication and connections within the community.

# Nominating Committee Chair

The PTA nominating committee is an elected committee that is responsible for recognizing and recruiting the most qualified people available for elected PTA positions.

#### □ Reflections Chair

▶ The Reflections Chair coordinate a theme based art contest (dance choreography, film production, literature, musical composition, photography or visual arts) among students for entry of an art item that fits the National PTA's annual theme. All aspects of communicating the program to the students, collecting applications (digital), judging entries, and award recognition are required.

#### ☐ Yearbook Co-chair

▶ Yearbook - Does layout for the entire yearbook, including staff, student photos as well as candids, clubs, etc. Manages cover art contest. Works with office staff to distribute yearbooks. Also needed is a yearbook fundraising chair.

Shrinking budgets. Increasing class sizes. Government mandates. The challenges of delivering quality education are real. Increased parental involvement is linked to improved academic performance and reduced behavioral issues among students. Grades are higher. Test scores improve. Attendance increases. Louise Archer ES PTA keeps the entire school community informed of current events, issues, and accomplishments via newsletters, emails, social media, and regular meetings. - Directory Update: Manpreet is having difficulty with the data upload and working with A to Z Connect. Hopeful to have this done by Friday, Nov 11th for parent review in the app. Reminder we are not printing a physical directory this year.
- Book Fair: The annual Book Fair is from Nov. 6th-21st. We will continuing using the virtual Book Fair format due to continued construction. There will be a website set up for our school where students and their families can purchase books. We will be using Bookworm Central, so we can expect the same high-quality selection of books we usually have. Books are shipped to students' homes for a small shipping fee (or free with a certain minimum purchase). Any proceeds will be used to support the LAES Library program and buy books for the library. We will also have virtual teacher wish lists for families that may want to purchase books to donate to a teacher or classroom.
- □ Food Drive: LAES is conducting another food drive (separate from the Madison Canned Food Drive) for our food insecure families to go home around Thanksgiving. If you are willing and able to donate any of the items listed below, we would greatly appreciate it. All items should come to the front office by November 15<sup>th</sup>. Mini Grants......Cathy Chen

- For those unfamiliar with the PTA's mini grant program, we solicit applications
  from teachers twice a year, usually after the 1st and 2nd quarter. This gives
  teachers time to figure out what's needed and for the kids to benefit from during
  the current school year.
- This year we've set aside \$10k and this Fall we've received 10 grant applications which were all approved by the PTA. These include:
  - ▶ Higgins (6 copies of 21 novel sets), \$1,116
  - ▶ Reilly (minimal pair and sound cue cards), \$324
  - 2nd grade (games and books), \$278
  - 4th grade (Scholastic Storyworks and Scholastic Scope), \$967
  - Monroe (storage containers and math resources), \$358
  - Malo (books related to students with disabilities), \$439
  - Special education (color printer and ink), \$320 (used classroom funds)
  - Bechtle (classroom decorations and supplies), \$324
  - ▶ PE (2 inflatable gaga pits), \$1,200
  - ▶ Monroe (Scholastic Scope), \$187
  - Akpinar (bibliotherapy books), \$63
  - Sobel (color laser printer), \$318

## TOTAL grants: \$5,893

 Applications will be sent out late Dec/early Jan for the second round. Please remind your teachers to keep a look out for it. We have about \$4k remaining this year.
