School Principal & VP Report..... Michelle Makrigiorgos & Jennifer Condra

We are just one week away from the phase two reopening of the school. Below is a breakdown of what to expect during this phase:

- Specials like band, strings, and art will be returning to the building.
- Third-grade classrooms will also be back, entering through the main hallway where the classrooms have a fresh new look.
- The technology wing, located at the front of the building, will house the computer lab, charging stations, and tech staff.
- The main office will be relocated next to the basketball courts, with a new main entry through Door 9 starting after spring break until the end of the school year.
- The office staff will move to a repurposed classroom, while Jennifer and Michelle will share a conference room next door.
- The office is expected to be fully operational after the start of the new school year, likely in September.
- Phase three will focus on renovating the library, aiming for a grand reopening over the summer for the new school year.
- The final touches will involve completing the field space and other remaining areas.
- Teachers will return on April 1st to prepare for the move, with everyone transitioning to the new spaces on April 3rd.
- Temporary changes to the arrival process will include a new front entrance and adjustments to the front walkway and ramp for accessibility compliance.
- Walkers and kindergarten pick-ups will have a designated area near the side of the school, ensuring a smooth transition once everyone gets accustomed to the new setup.

• Plans are in place to improve the bus loop and other facilities for the upcoming school year.

Treasurer's Report......Steve Soliday

LA5K & Sun Run:

- We have accumulated \$4,233 from family cheerleader memberships and sign-ups to support the race budget.
- The company handling the sign-ups is sending weekly deposits, with an upcoming one of around \$700 this week.
- Our income target is \$10,000 with expenses set at \$5,000, aiming to achieve a net profit of \$5,000, regardless of the method used.

Yearbook:

- Although we've received significant booster ads funds, it seems we are reaching the end of that source.
- Based on last year's figures, we anticipated an income of \$2,400 which we are below by ~\$1,000. More may pour in at the last minute however this is something to note for future budgeting purposes.

Skate Night:

- Skate Night was a success as we met the minimum amount required by SkateQuest to avoid owing them.
- Despite only making a small profit, we avoided any liabilities, with \$300 allocated for day of change for participants paying in cash.

Program:

• I have entirely removed programs from the budget sheet as they are now managed through HomeRoom.

Budget Amendments:

- The unexpected \$9,000 income from the Read-a-thon was a great surprise, especially since the idea was if we could generate even \$5, it would have been a win to encourage children's reading. Thank you to Katie for volunteering and making this happen.
 - o I'm proposing that we add a budget line for income of \$9,000.
 - Two specific funding requests have emerged:
 - Science Olympiad, who have qualified for States this year, has requested assistance in purchasing team T-shirts. We've agreed to fund a portion of the cost. Past records indicate that the Science Olympiad team faced financial challenges last year, underscoring the importance of providing ongoing support for them.
 - o I'd like to propose adding \$300 to Science Olympiad.
 - Sunshine Times received numerous submissions, resulting in a longer issue, which is fantastic. However, the increased length

incurs higher printing costs. Considering adding an extra \$300 for the additional expenses.

- o I'd like to propose adding \$300 to Sunshine Times.
- All three amendments have been voted on and approved with a quorum.

- We're around six weeks out from the race, we currently have 90 participants, and we expect this number to rise as the event approaches.
- Next week before spring break, I plan to distribute another Tuesday folder with a QR code, and post something similar after the break for people to remember through Facebook. I've also reminded parents through room parent emails and the Sunbeam newspaper, and we will send an Evite post-spring break.
- The Sun Run will take place on the track, offering flexibility in the distance for younger kids. We have arranged for a DJ and plan to have activities for the younger kids during the 5K run.

I am meeting with Madison staff to finalize logistics and restroom access. 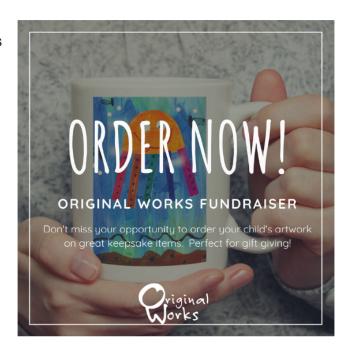
